

Acts 25

Background Information

- Paul's Third Missionary Journey ends (Acts 21)
- Paul travels (against the advice of others) to Jerusalem (Acts 21)
- The Jews seize Paul in the temple, and assault him (Acts 21)
- The Roman authorities intervene, and rescue Paul (Acts 21)
- The Romans allow Paul to address the angry Jewish Mob (Acts 22)
- The Roman Captain decrees that the Jews must present their case against Paul (Acts 22)
- A group of Jews plots to assassinate Paul (Acts 23)
- Upon discovery of the plot, the Roman Captain sent Paul to Caesarea to be examined by Felix, the Roman Governor/Procurator (Acts 23)
- The Jews travel to Caesarea to present their case against Paul to Felix (Acts 24)
- Felix deferred making a judgement in the case, hoping to extort money from Paul (Acts 24)
- Paul was kept in prison in Caesarea for two years, until Festus replaced Felix as Governor (Acts 24)
